

The Role of the BACCH Regional Coordinator

- 1. To co-ordinate BACCH activities in the Region;**
- 2. To cascade information on BACCH activities to members in their Region and promote members' tools, e.g. the Website and Members' Area;**
- 3. To contribute to, and encourage regional members to participate in, consultation documents;**
- 4. To liaise with the BACCH Administrator to ensure that contact details of regional membership is up to date;**
- 5. To maximise membership of BACCH through the promotion of the organisation with students, trainees and other paediatricians in the region;**
- 6. To organise at least one BACCH Regional meeting a year;**
- 7. To attend biannual BACCH Council meetings;**
- 8. To write a report on BACCH Activities in your region for BACCH News at least once a year.**
- 9. To advise the Regional Paediatric Adviser on education and training for community doctors.** The exact nature of this role varies from region to region – for example, it could involve being a member of the regional paediatric training committee, ensuring community paediatric representation on RITA assessments as some examples.
- 10. To advise the Regional Paediatric Adviser on job descriptions.**

It is estimated that the role requires 1 hour per week (equivalent to 0.25 PA)
