

# BRITISH ASSOCIATION FOR COMMUNITY CHILD HEALTH (BACCH) MEMBERSHIP SUBSCRIPTION FEES 1<sup>ST</sup> JUNE 2010 – 31<sup>ST</sup> MAY 2011

## 1. Membership Type

BACCH offers the following types of Membership:

- (a) Ordinary - all medical practitioners
- (b) Affiliate - all non-medical practitioners
- (c) Retired
- (d) Trainee - specialist registrar members of the RCPCH
- (e) Overseas - members residing in less prosperous countries (as designated by the World Bank – list available from the BACCH office)

As part of the annual subscription, members receive the quarterly BACCH News, monthly email bulletins delivered to your inbox, plus reduced delegate rates at the annual scientific meeting.

In addition, members have the option to subscribe to its official journal *Child: Care, Health and Development*. The journal is published bi-monthly and members receive a reduced subscription. Members can choose to receive online access only to the journal, or online access plus a print copy. Online access details will be sent to you by the journal publishers Wiley-Blackwell.

## 2. Subscription Fees: 1st June 2010 - 31st May 2011

The BACCH subscription year runs from 1st June to 31st May. The subscription rates for 2010-2011 are as follows:

## 3. Applications received part way through the subscription year

Applications for membership received part way through the year, i.e. after 1st June 2010, will be charged a pro rata subscription fee for the remainder of the subscription year.

## 4. Payment of Subscription Fees

In order to reduce administrative costs, we require all applicants holding a UK current bank account to complete a direct debit mandate form. Cheques are normally only accepted from those applicants from outside the UK, and such cheques should be made payable to 'BACCH' by either a Sterling International Money Order or a Sterling Bank Draft. An additional administration fee of £10 is applicable on all fees paid by cheque. Ordinary members subscribing to the journal *Child: Care, Health & Development* pay their annual subscription fee in two instalments, with 50% of the amount taken on 1st June, and the remaining amount taken on 1st December.

## 5. Gift Aid

We ask that all members complete and return the Gift Aid form. This allows BACCH, as a charity, to claim the tax back on your subscription. Under the Gift Aid scheme, charities can reclaim an extra 25% in tax on every eligible donation by a UK taxpayer. Until 5 April 2011, the government will also give UK charities an extra 3% of all eligible donations. If you pay tax at the higher rate, you can reclaim tax relief on your gross donation at 20% (i.e. the difference between the higher rate of tax at 40% and the basic rate at 20%).
